





















General Comments:

1. A skateboard park was mentioned several times but isn't included on this form because it has dedicated funding.
2. Basketball Courts received more support in the past so there's concern that the supporters weren't heard from. The courts have been designed through construction documents and were pulled out of phase one so they could be constructed at the same time as the skateboard park. It makes sense to do this since access to the skateboard park and construction staging will be directly over the basketball court area.
3. Dakota Street Parking is rated as a low priority. However, Parks has heard from other community groups that more parking in the area is desired. The cost for this item may be lower than estimated since it entails opening up an existing parking lot currently used by Park employees during normal business hours. Some conversations with community members afterwards made it clear that some people may not have understood the lot already exists. This item will be researched, and if the cost is minimal, it will be recommended.
4. Parks staff will use the above list to generate a recommendation for future development that reflects the priorities of the community, addresses construction feasibility and sequencing, and is approved by Parks management.
